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MINISTER'S MESSAGE

My dear friends,

I am writing this letter to you in the middle of the Days of National Mourning. The Queen has died and as her death is mourned we hear so many stories of the Queen. She was, like all of us, at its simplest, a human being. She was a much loved mother, grandmother and great grandmother. She was a woman of great faith and seems to have been a marvellous listener. As we all saw recently she had a sense of humour - remember her parachute jump with James Bond at the London Olympics and her tea with Paddington for her 70th Jubilee. Now, Prince Charles is King Charles the Third. As many people have said it is the end of an era. It is an end that has been anticipated and planned for with meticulous detail. At times like this there can be great comfort in ritual.

As we heard of the death of the Queen, I am sure that we will have remembered our own family members who have died. We will have remembered our own days of mourning and for some of our congregation these days are now. As Christians we have the sure and certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life but that faith does not preclude our weeping; our weeping sometimes at unexpected times when a word is spoken or an object picked up. I take great comfort from the shortest verse in the Bible, 'Jesus wept.' He wept because his friend Lazarus had died, and yes, Jesus knew that He would raise Lazarus from the dead, but he still wept. So, as Christians these tears of Jesus reassure us when we mourn and weep at the death of someone whom we have loved.

In difficult times be kind to one another, be kind to yourself and may we all know God's love surrounding and supporting us.
