The two congregations united two and a half years ago in the midst of Covid. You have learned how to live-stream services allowing some of your housebound members to worship week by week; you have started the Connect Hub, the Cafe-style church in the Outreach Centre; a Bible Study group has begun and very recently a prayer group and then there are all the ongoing organisations. A huge amount of work has been done to look after the property and finances of this large and busy church. All of this is because of your commitment to serving Christ within this large parish.

I hope that by the time most of you will read this that St George's will have formed its Nominating Committee and work will be underway to prayerfully seek the person whom God wants as minister for St George's. This is a demanding and responsible task for the individuals who will make up the committee. St George's Manse Update from our Session Clerk

The manse is located at 10 Hawick Avenue in the Stanely area of Paisley.

It is a 1970's built detached house with gardens to the front and rear, and comprises on the ground floor, an L-shaped lounge with dining room, kitchen, WC and small area to hang coats, etc. just inside the front door.

On the upper floor there are 4 bedrooms, or 3 bedrooms and a study, and a family bathroom. It is centrally heated by a gas boiler.

Our property team, and a few other volunteers, have been hard at work over recent months undertaking painting work to both inside and outside of the property, as well as repairing several items which needed attention.

We have employed a specialist contractor to replace the soffits, facias, gutters and downpipes.





The garden is mainly grass, but a couple of flower beds in the front area have been dug out and covered with weed suppression material and gravel (hopefully to stop weeds growing).

Before a minister can be shown the manse, we have to have it inspected and approved by Presbytery as to decoration state etc. This means that we cannot at this stage allow a minister to chose colour schemes and for us to decorate accordingly before entry, so it will be a neutral colour scheme.

The flowers in the church are always a beautiful addition to the sanctuary on a Sunday morning and are appreciated by members of the congregation who receive a bouquet to acknowledge important life events; births, birthdays, anniversaries, illness, bereavement, etc.

If you would like to donate flowers, in order that the committee can ensure this continues to happen, please speak to a member of the team after church on a Sunday or add your name to the list on the notice board. There are a number of dates still available in October and November this year.

One challenge which we will all hopefully embrace is to contribute as fully as we can to the Night Before Christmas appeal which provides less fortunate children and adults across the West of Scotland with gifts at Christmas. We very much hope that once more you, our Congregation, will help us with this very deserving cause.

By the time you read this Makenzie McNally will have attended Renfrewshire Council's civic reception to mark the achievement of boys who received their Queen's badge in the last session. We've just heard that this badge is to be renamed the King's badge but as yet we're unclear just when that's to happen.

They worked hard blowing up balloons to hand out and then had the lovely duty of presenting completers with their medals.
