Friends,

It's vital the boys understand that BB is much bigger than just us and great to do this with lots of laughter not to mention eats and games!

In the last article I spoke of our overnight at the church and how much the boys enjoyed it. At their request we're doing it all again, just with a different programme and hopefully better weather to allow some outdoor events. This won't take place until May but preparations are already underway.

In the meantime our older boys are planning trips to complete some more of their 140 challenges, one to do some trampolining and the other to Laser Quest.

AUDIO VISUAL EQUIPMENT

A new system will soon be installed in the sanctuary comprising five large TV screens mounted at appropriate points so that they can be seen by everyone in the congregation. The necessary control

equipment will be installed at the current live stream control area in the balcony.

The screens will be used to display the words of hymns and readings, as well as any other visual aids that may enhance the service. This will bring us in line with many other churches who are currently using such systems successfully.

The total cost of the work will be about £12000, and whilst we have applied to the

Presbytery for a grant from funds which exist for such equipment, a large part of the cost will come from

our own resources.
