#### **OUR FINANCES**

To bring you up to date with our current financial affairs below is a comparison of the April to June 2025 income and spending with the previous three months:

2025	Jan - March	April - June
INCOME	£37,512	£42,029
SPENDING	£34,919	£42,744



Income has increased due to:

- a general increase in offerings and income tax refunds under Gift Aid
- an increase in donations, some given for a specific purpose e.g. extension of the sanctuary balustrade
- additional fund raising activity e.g. the Bazaar

Spending is up, substantially, in the second quarter when significant annual payments are made e.g. Presbytery Dues, alarm contract and boiler servicing. We also had dry rot repairs in the sanctuary and maintenance work on the sanctuary roof. The roof repair to the damage caused by storm Eowyn was covered by insurance.

We have a small deficit of £715 in the quarter.
