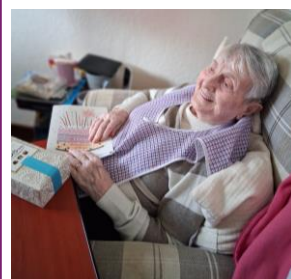

Summer Holiday Club

When planning began a few months ago none of us could have imagined the scale of success of our summer club. Over the 5 weeks of its running more than 100 children from across our town have taken part. Through singing, crafts, games, stories and puzzles the stories of five Superheroes from the Bible have been shared. From Esther through to the greatest Superhero of all, Jesus, with Joseph, Daniel and Ruth in between children have learned how the love of God shaped their lives.

Iain Shaw has been instrumental in leading the team of around 25 volunteers. Behind the scenes there's lots of work done from registration, material planning and sourcing including the all-important weekly snacks, technical support and setting up. It's very much a team effort to ensure the best possible outcome each week. Our new purple St George's T-shirts allow leaders to be easily identified both to children and parents/carers.

A new idea for this year saw Douglas and another team of volunteers providing a space for parents to come together over tea and coffee while their children took part. This simple provision has been hugely appreciated and has provided an opportunity for us to develop relationships with families.

Each week the children receive a Newsletter and through this we can share some information on some of the many activities we have available for children at St George's. We very much hope that some of them might take up the invitation to join some of the groups. It's been great to see children at the Summer Club who already attend groups such as Arts & Crafts. The Newsletter also contains the weekly challenge for kids to complete at home and post in our Post box as they arrive the next week. Participation is rewarded with a small prize, always enthusiastically received.

The Club ended its run with many children and their families attending worship on 9 August before having a picnic lunch and boarding the bus for an afternoon of games and fun on the beach at Troon.

Through a successful application to our Council's Summer of Fun fund all the activities, including our bus trip to Troon, has been free. This has been a real bonus and we're very grateful to Renfrewshire Council.

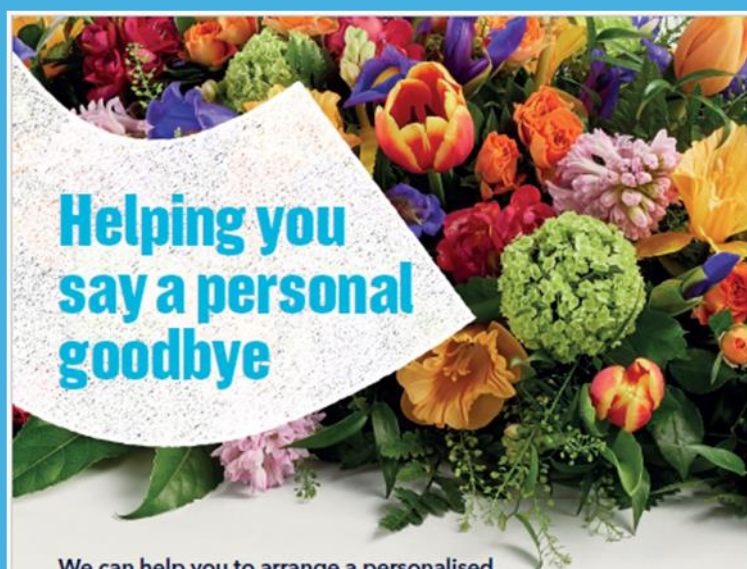

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Working hard to make Fair Trade easy for you

On the 7th of May, the Buddies Chill and Chat group were joined by Linda, the Education Officer from the Fairtrade shop, Rainbow Turtle and Elise, from the shop, who brought a variety of Fairtrade goods to sell. Linda spoke to the group about the importance of Fairtrade, the benefits it gives to the farmers and plantation workers and how it helps fight the unfairness that keeps millions of farmers in poverty. We watched videos that showed real farmers explaining the benefits that being part of the Fairtrade movement bring. We also found out that as well as getting a fairer, consistent price for their goods, farmers also get an extra amount of money called the "Fairtrade Premium" to spend on things their communities or businesses need such as clean water, classrooms or clinics. We had a very enjoyable, informative and thought-provoking night and lots of us bought goodies from the stall. The takeaway message from the night was that, if possible, please buy Fairtrade products as it makes a real difference to farmers and their communities across the world. If you want to find out more about Fairtrade, there is information on the Eco Church notice board in the large hall or pop into the Rainbow Turtle shop on Gauze St in Paisley town centre.

The Annual Bowling and BBQ took place at Wellmeadow Bowling Club on 8 July.

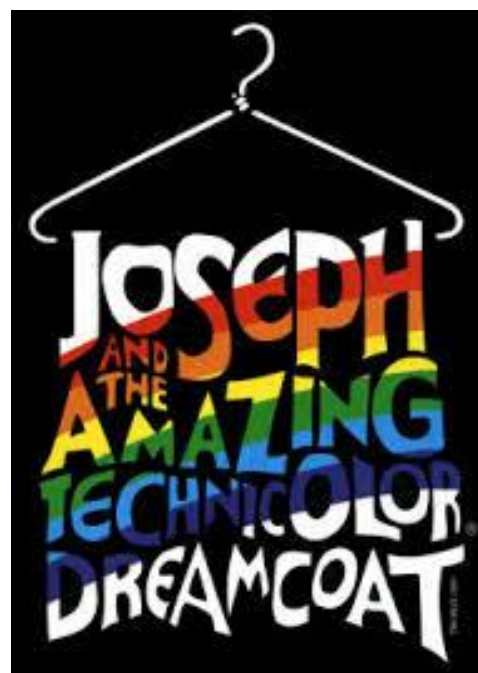
